DUMP VOUCHERS ARE BACK!

Limited to one PER City of Belding household (including apartments), you may pick up your FREE Dump Voucher at City Hall beginning June 1, 2025.

Vouchers can be used from July 1, 2025 through September 30, 2025 at Pitsch Landfill.

Each voucher has a limit of a \$25 standard load. Any excess to the standard load will be charged directly to the resident by Pitsch Landfill. Additionally, all loads must be covered or Pitsch Landfill will assess a \$10 fee to the resident.



BELDING POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Belding Police Department received a very generous donation from a local couple. The money is being used to purchase new body cameras for the officers and a drone equipped with a flood light, loud speaker and thermal camera. The drone is an invaluable asset to the community that will help locate missing people, provide detailed arial images of crash and fire scenes, analyze traffic and parking issues during large scale events such as the Macker tournament and Labor Day Celebration and be utilized to assist with officer safety.

REQUESTING POLICE ASSISTANCE—The Belding Police Department does not have a local dispatch center. Belding Police Officers are dispatched to calls for service by Ionia County Central Dispatch. To request police assistance for nonemergency situations or to report a crime not in progress you **must** contact Ionia County Central Dispatch at **(616)527-0400 extension 4**. For emergencies or crimes in progress dial **911**.

BICYCLES—Each year the Belding Police Department recovers many lost or stolen bicycles that go unclaimed. If your bicycle is lost or stolen, please report it or, at minimum, check with us to see if we have it. As a reminder, bicyclists on the roadway must obey the same laws as a person driving a motor vehicle. This means you must come to a complete stop at stop signs/stop lights and signal your intent to turn or change lanes.

PARKS—Park hours are 7:30am to 11:30pm. Bathrooms are open daily 8am to 8pm from late spring through September, weather permitting. Bathrooms that are damaged or littered beyond regular use will be locked and not reopened until they are cleaned or repaired on regular business days. If we all do our part, they will stay open daily.

CODE ENFORCEMENT/ANIMAL CONTROL

ANIMALS—Spring and Summer bring an increase of animal complaints and it is important for residents to remember to keep their dogs and cats confined to their yard. City ordinance stipulates that there are to be no more than two dogs and two cats per residence without a special permit. Animals walked in the City Park areas must be on a leash.

BRUSH—Please remember that no brush can be placed at the curb until the 18th of the month. After it is removed, no brush can be put to the curb until the 18th of the next month. Brush placed at the curb must have all cut ends facing the same direction, placed parallel to the roadway, and can be no longer than 8 feet/96 inches long.

BLIGHT—Grass can be no longer than 10 inches, and leaves must be raked.

GRASS CLIPPINGS ARE NO LONGER ALLOWED LOOSE or DUMPED AT CURBSIDE. Grass clippings MUST be placed in paper yard waste bags and set at the curb by 7am Monday. The bags MAY NOT be put out before Sunday evening at 6pm and must be at curbside by 7am on Monday for pick up.

GARBAGE/TRASH—Garbage and Trash in bags or receptacles may not be put to the curb earlier than 24 hours before pick up day. Emptied containers MUST NOT remain at curb and MUST be removed within 24 hours of pick-up.

UNLICENSED OR INOPERABLE VEHICLES—No unlicensed or inoperable vehicles are allowed within the city limits, unless stored within a four-sided enclosed building. The storage of building materials outside of an enclosed building is prohibited without a building permit. Any chemical containers (oil, gas, coolant, etc.) must be disposed of in an environmentally safe manner. Outside storage of these chemicals is a violation of City Ordinance.



It's Spring—If you are getting the itch to do your yard clean up, please make sure you are burning only the proper materials in your bon fire pit. If you have questions on what you are allowed to burn, please call 616-794-1900 x212.

*REMINDER: Child Safety Seat Law changes effective April 2, 2025. *

All children under 2 years old must remain rear facing in their car seats. All children between 2 and 5 must be belted in a 5-point harness, but can be in a forward-facing seat. All children between 5 and 8 must be in a booster seat and belted. Once the child gets 4'9" tall, they can get out of the booster. All children above 8 and until their 13th birthday must be in the rear seat and belted. No one below 13 years old can be seated in the front seat.

The Belding Fire Department has 3 nationally trained child seat installation technicians. We are here to assist you with any installations or questions that you may have.



DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

2025 Brush Pick-up will be the last full week of each month as follows:

April 21-25,

May 26-30,

June 23-27,

July 21-25,

August 25-29,

September 22-26

Brush must be in line with the street at the curb but not the road. All cut ends must face the same direction and be placed in a clear area, at least 4 feet away from any obstructions, included but not limited to: Consumer poles and guide wires, telephone poles, overhead wires, walls, fences, mailboxes, or any other obstacles that could prevent a safe and efficient pick-up for staff and equipment.

FAILURE TO FOLLOW ALL OF THE ABOVE INSTRUCTIONS WILL RESULT IN NON-REMOVAL.

2025 Bagged Yard Waste Pick -up will be on Mondays, beginning in April.

Spring fire hydrant flushing will take place on April 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 18.

ASSESSOR

Property Tax Exemptions—This time of the year I am frequently asked what property tax exemptions are available and do senior citizens get any special tax relief? Neither the City of Belding nor the State of Michigan offer any special tax relief based on age. There are three programs that allow for property tax exemptions:

Principal Residence Exemption (PRE)—The PRE is an exemption from the local school operating millage. In Belding it's 18 mills. Homeowners who own and occupy their home as a primary residence are eligible to claim the Principal Residence Exemption (if you look at the upper right-hand corner of your Assessment Change Notice, 100% will be there). Homeowners are allowed to claim only one Principal Residence Exemption in Michigan and cannot claim a similar exemption in another state at the same time. The PRE form must be completed and returned to the Assessor on or before June 1st of each year to receive the exemption for the current year property taxes. The form does not need to be filed every year. Homeowners who sell their home, move out or utilize the home as a rental need to rescind or remove the PRE by filing the form; Request to Rescind Principal Residence Exemption.

Poverty Exemption—Homeowners who cannot afford their taxes may qualify for a Poverty Exemption. Please consult our Poverty Exemption Guidelines on our web page or contact me to see if you qualify.

Disabled Veterans Exemption—Per the State of Michigan, certain disabled veterans may be exempt from paying real property tax. To receive the exemption, the veteran must:

- 1.) be a Michigan resident;
- 2.) own and occupy the home (referred to as your Principal Residence);

be disabled as a result of service from which the veteran was honorably discharged (100% disabled), or the unremarried, surviving spouse of the disabled veteran.

To receive the discount veterans must complete the Disabled Veterans Exemption Affidavit and include a copy of their DD-214 and the Departments of Veterans Affairs letter stating they are 100% disabled. These forms are on our web site: https://belding.mi.us/assessor.php.

FINANCE DEPARTMENT

Water/Sewer — Bills for the 12-1-24 through 2-28-25 cycle dates were mailed prior to April 1st and are due <u>in office by April 30th</u> to avoid a 10% late fee. We cannot accept postmark or check dates as the date of payment.

EARLY POOL FILLING — Late spring will bring warmer weather which may have you thinking about filling your pool early for the upcoming summer of fun in the sun! If you choose to fill your pool prior to the quarterly readings in early June (for the 3-1 through 5-31 cycle), we ask that you write down the numbers on your SENSUS water meter **BEFORE** and **AFTER** you have filled the pool and call those readings into the office, at 616-794-1900 ext. 217, by the first week of June in order to have the appropriate credit applied to the sewer portion of the July bill.

Not planning to fill your pool until mid-June or later? Not to worry! During the summer quarter (6-1 through 8-31) a "summer sewer discount" is considered for any residential account that does not have a separate irrigation meter. This discount is reflected on the October bill and is based on the average usage for the non-summer months; you will not be billed for sewer usage that exceeds your average usage during the 6-1 through 8-31 cycle.
