A Message from the Assessor

Assessors in the State of Michigan are responsible to maintain the State Equalized Value (SEV) and Taxable Value (TV). First, let's make sure you understand the difference.

The SEV should be 50% of the property's True Cash Value or Market Value. This value is determined by the physical attributes of the property and studies of recent sales (2-year sale studies are the most common). The TV is determined by the Consumers Price Index (CPI), not to exceed 5%.

The last decade has seen residential sale studies with increases between 5 to 20%, while the Consumer Price Index only exceeded 5% twice, this year and 2023.

Towards the end of February, you will get an Assessment Change Notice from me. This change notice will identify the proposed Taxable Value and State Equalized Value (SEV) for each parcel that you own.

Please note that some boards/commissions may strongly suggest and/or require training and/or certification, which is offered to you at no cost upon your appointment. It is not necessary for there to be a vacancy to apply as applications will be kept on file for one (1) year from the date of filing and are considered for appointment as positions become available. Police Department

The Belding Police Department would like to remind you that school is back in session. If the red lights are flashing on the school bus you must STOP. If you are a parent or guardian picking your child up from school or you are attending an afterschool activity, please be mindful not to use or park in emergency fire lanes.

As a reminder, starting November 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025 the city police will be enforcing the No Parking Ordinance. No parking is allowed on city streets from 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.

Code Enforcement

Property owners and residents are responsible for the maintenance of their property and the adjoining right of way. Please take the time to trim along the edge of the roadway, near sidewalks, around sign posts and fire hydrants.

Sidewalks need to have the grass trimmed that grows over them. This process will define the edge of the sidewalk for walkers as well as promote drainage and maintain the integrity of the concrete.

MI VOTE, MI WAY Your voting options



ALL registered voters in Michigan have the right to vote an absentee ballot either in per-

son at the City Clerk's office or by mail.

Absentee ballots will be available at the City Clerk's Office in late September.

Registered voters in the City of Belding may request an APPLICATION to receive an absentee ballot for a specific election - OR to join a **PERMANENT ABSENTEE BALLOT** list to automatically receive a ballot for EVERY election affecting the City of Belding.

Absentee ballots may be returned by US Mail in the postage paid envelope that is included with your ballot, in person at City Hall or in the **NEW ABSENTEE BALLOT** DROP BOX outside of City Hall.

The new drop box is for election use only. Please continue to use the other drop box for water bills, tax payments and all other correspondence.

Expect long lines in the polls on Election Day! Avoid the lines by utilizing other safe and secure options available to you.

Michigan Election Law now allows for nine (9) days of ear-**OTING** ly in-person voting. This means that you

will vote your ballot and feed it into the tabulator BEFORE Election VOTES ARE NOT TALLIED UNTIL THE POLLS CLOSE ON ELECTION DAY.

ALL early in-person voting for registered voters in Ionia County takes place in downtown Ionia at 302 W. Main Street (the former Mercantile Bank/ Ionia County National Bank location) starting Saturday, October 26 through Sunday, November 3 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.



All in-person Election Day voting for registered voters in the City of Belding will take place at the Belrockton, 108 Hanover Street from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.



REQUIRING SPECIAL <u>ACCOMMODATIONS MAY ENTER</u> **MUST IMMEDIATELY EXIT** THE POLLING LOCATION THROUGH THE THROUGH THE BACK DOOR. BACK DOOR.

TO MAINTAIN ORDER IN THE POLLS AND FOR SECURITY PURPOSES, ALL VOTERS* MUST ENTER THE POLLING LOCATION THROUGH THE FRONT DOOR AND AFTER **CASTING** YOUR BALLOT, THIS PROCEDURE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

Additional handicap parking spots will be designated in the parking lot behind the Belrockton. There is a ramp at the back of the building for those who may need this added convenience.

Please bring your photo ID with you to the polls.

No campaigning in any manner is allowed in the polls or within 100 feet of the polling location.

You will be asked to remove or conceal anything that is or could be perceived as campaign-related. Refusal to do so may result in your removal from the polls by law enforcement and/or you may be prohibited from voting.

You may park in the Masonic Lodge parking lot, the library parking lot, designated spots on Hanover Street or behind the Belrockton while voting.

NEW Billing System

We recently upgraded our billing system which includes customer-friendly enhancements.

NEW! We now offer the capability to look up your water/sewer bill account information by entering the *BS&A Online Pin Number* found on your utility bill.

NEW! Customers receiving separate water bills for domestic and irrigation meters will now receive one bill for both meters. For your convenience, the charges will still be broken down, however you will now only have one account number and will only need to remit one payment.

\$ Saving Tip:

Be sure to unhook garden hoses from your house before the winter weather sets in! This will help to ensure that the water is not accidently left on, possibly causing it to freeze and break and/or to prevent water running/leaking from the spigot without you noticing right away.

Water/Sewer Bills

Water and/or sewer bills are invoiced and mailed quarterly. Below is the billing schedule: January 1st Bill: (September 1 through November 30 cycle dates) Due by January 30th April 1st Bill: (December 1 through February 28/29 cycle dates) Due by April 30th July 1st Bill: (March 1 through May 31 cycle dates) Due by July 30th October 1st Bill: (June 1 through August 31 cycle dates) Due by October 30th Please note that payment must be received in office BY the 30th to avoid late fees.

Taxes

Summer 2024 taxes were due by August 15. A 3% late fee has been added to any unpaid taxes. Please contact the City Treasurer at 616-794-1900, extension 203 for the amount now due.

Winter 2024 taxes will be mailed by December 1, 2024 and are due IN OFFICE BY February 14, 2025. This bill will not include the balance due for the summer taxes, if any.





Helpful Tips Regarding Payments

All payments are processed on the day they are received IN OFFICE. Postmark dates or check dates will not be considered as the date of payment.

Payment for taxes must be kept separate from payments for water/sewer bills. Combined payments will be returned to you to be separated which may result in a late fee.

For our increased efficiency and accuracy, please include the barcoded portion of your water/sewer bill with your payment when paying through the mail or utilizing the drop box.

When paying taxes in full, please remit payment only for the exact amount owed.

Did you know you can build a credit on your water/sewer bill account by making smaller payments PRIOR to when the bills are mailed out? Several residents either drop off payments or set up Bill Pay with their bank to send a check for the average of their quarterly bill weekly, bi-weekly or monthly throughout the year to build a credit on their accounts. Any payment made before the bills have been printed will be reflected as a credit on the bill and you then would only owe the remaining balance, or could even have a credit remaining depending on how much of a credit you have accumulated.
